Lisbon Dear brothers and sisters just thought I would drop you a line to let you know I have safely arrived in this beautiful city. The city is sweltering under the heat which they are blaming on the wind from the Sahara! I am not complaining I can assure you. As usual my journey was not without

its moments as, when I finally arrived at the entry gate to the plane at Luton for the flight to Lisbon, I discovered I had lost my boarding card. Fortunately, Our Blessed Lady was clearly very keen that I should make it to Fatima as they let me on. Half way through the flight I discovered the card in my hip pocket. Mind you, by the time you get through security with belts off and baggage searched, you are not really sure whether you are coming or going. I made a resolution that next time I will print two copies of the boarding pass and keep one in a safe place.

Today I visited the beautiful statue of Christ the King which looks over the River Tagus and the city. It is a smaller edition of the immense statue which is iconic of Rio de Janeiro, in Brazil. It was erected in thanksgiving for Portugal being kept out of the Second World War. It is a living monument as there is a beautiful chapel at the base and another beautiful Oratory at the top, dedicated to the Sacred Heart. Whilst it offers wonderful views over the city it is situated in a beautiful sanctuary, creating not simply a tourist site but also a place of prayer.

I am staying in a house for retired priests which makes the celebration of Mass each day so much easier and offers the chance to meet other priests. I have been taken round by a couple of young men who are members of a new religious movement in the Church, called the Heralds of the Gospel. Their habits are very colourful indeed and they have been most welcoming and very good company. I have two more days here before going on to Fatima. God bless. Fr. Joe
